From Pastor Cathy

A few weeks ago, I lamented during worship my disappointment in the General Conference's legislation to:

1) Remove our support from the Religious Coalition for Reproductive Choice; 2) A lack of will to divest from Fossil Fuels; and 3) The inability to move forward to offer full inclusion. I am profoundly grateful, however, for the oasis & privilege to serve in the PNW. Our United Methodist Annual Conference just finished, and we voted non-concurrence and nonconformity on three vital pieces of legislation out of General Conference.

1. We voted to become members and offer support for the Religious Coalition for Reproductive Choice. United Methodists started this organization, along with a couple other denominations, following the Supreme Court Roe V. Wade decision.
2. We plan to divest from Fossil Fuels by 2018, following the lead of the United Church of Christ.
3. Following on the heels of New England, Desert Southwest, Cal-Pacific & Cal-Nevada's Annual Conference statements for full inclusion, we passed an "Action of Nonconformity".

In light of the Orlando Massacre, a vicious hate crime, Bishop Minerva Carcano boldly spoke out and raised the question of how complicit United Methodists have been in fostering such hate: *"Is it possible that we United Methodists with such a negative attitude and position against LGBTQIA persons contribute to such a crime? We cannot just stand-by and allow what happened in Orlando to go by without our deep and prayerful reflection and our repentance and conversion wherever that is necessary in the life of our Church."*


After much debate, legislation received from a task force was approved by the members of the Pacific Northwest Annual Conference. It passed with an overwhelming 80% of the vote from clergy & lay members.

*The PNWAC will not conform or comply with provisions of the Discipline which discriminate against LGBTQIA+\* persons, including marriage, the incompatibility clause, ordination and appointments, homosexual unions, chargeable offenses pertaining to being “a self avowed practicing homosexual” or to officiating at weddings for couples regardless of the sex of the partners.*

*The PNWAC and its members will not participate in or conduct judicial procedures related to the Discipline’s prohibitions against LGBTQIA+\* persons. The PNWAC will realign its funding to reflect these commitments, using no reserve funds to pay for judicial procedures related to the Book of Discipline’s prohibitions against LGBTQIA+ persons. We ask the Connectional Table to lead and fund efforts in cultural competency, anti-racism, anti-sexism, anti-ageism, anti-homophobia, and anti-oppression training at the conference and district levels, as well as for advocacy and implementation efforts related to the same.*

What a privilege and honor it is to serve with and among you all!

Jennifer Bird, a teacher in Portland, OR, asks us to think about things Biblical, such as is found in Genesis 2:24-25. She notes that all English translations, except for the Contemporary English Version, use "the man and his wife" in these two verses, instead of what would be more consistent: the man and his woman. This is a small distinction with very far-reaching implications.


The man, leaving his parents, clings to his "wife", which suggests a marriage has taken place, ordained by God. This is the go-to verse to justify marriage as between a man and a woman, period. However, the Bible contains many other examples of marriage of which we do not approve, such as polygamy, levirate marriage, and laws that state a woman must marry her rapist, among others.

While many people expend a great deal of energy trying to defend their ideal version of marriage and say that sex before marriage is a sin, the Hebrew Bible does not support this. A careful reading would reveal that, having had sex, the two people become married.

Vigil for Orlando Shooting


