## ***From Pastor Cathy***

I want to take you with me, for a moment, on my second week at the Academy for Spiritual Formation. And many thanks to Tanya Sorenson for leading the end of worship so I could make it to my plane on time. We are so blessed with so many “Super Stewards” at UCUP!!!

It's back to basics with spiritual practices. One of our speakers this week is Marjorie Thompson, who wrote “Soul Feast: An Invitation to the Christian Spiritual Life” 25 years ago. In it she lays out basic practices to open our hearts to God and getting to know the heart of God. It includes: Spiritual Reading, approaches to prayer, reclaiming Sabbath, fasting, self-examination, confession, following a rule of life. I want to share a few glimpses from the chapters on worship and on hospitality. They are simple basic reminders of life with God and our shared life together.

**Worship** is rooted in who God is and in God's purposes. We worship because it is natural to respond to the mystery that illuminates life. Worship ushers us into the presence of the living God and demands the attention, receptivity, and response of our whole being.

We need to experience our Christian life as rooted in the larger community of faith. We need the prayers of others as they need our prayers. We cannot live the spiritual life in total isolation from Christian community. To be Christian is to be joined to the body of Christ. The visible way the church expresses this reality is by gathering in the Spirit to receive and respond to God's living Word.

We gather for worship to remember who and whose we are. We come to recount the stories that shape our faith, stories that turn us from a collection of individuals into a community with a common source and vision. It also means that we can present a united front “against the cosmic powers of this present darkness”. It takes a communal witness of light, truth, and peace to overcome the corporate power of darkness, deception, and destruction in this world.

We can revitalize our practice of personal worship. Our own daily prayer becomes tilled soil for perceiving the seed of God's Word in the liturgy.

During worship you may find it helpful to arrive early in order to prepare oneself to worship from the heart. Ask the Spirit to be actively present and known in the gathered community and for the faithfulness and integrity of the church in its worship and mission.

Be prepared to hear God speak - to you personally and to the whole gathering.

Pay attention to the meaning of the printed prayers.

Listen to the words of hymns with an ear for the meaning.

Listen carefully to any Psalm you may recite. The Psalms give us a realistic voice for praise, anguish, yearning and confession - a way to reveal the depths of the human soul to God. Regular recitation of the Psalms gives us a repertoire of prayers known by heart that can anchor us through the gale winds of life.

If you are given an opportunity to pray silently, offer to God what you discover in your heart at the time.

**Hospitality** begins with God. Until we are deeply rooted in the experience of God's grace, we have neither the living example nor the strength of commitment to live hospitably in a hostile world. When we become willing to receive from God, we naturally express the hospitality of gratitude. We offer hospitality to God when we make ourselves consciously present to the Divine Presence and listen for what the Spirit is communicating. In the story of Mary and Martha, Mary chooses to receive the gift of Jesus' presence with her own presence. Is it possible that Jesus experienced Mary's listening as a deeper act of hospitality than the provision of food and drink?

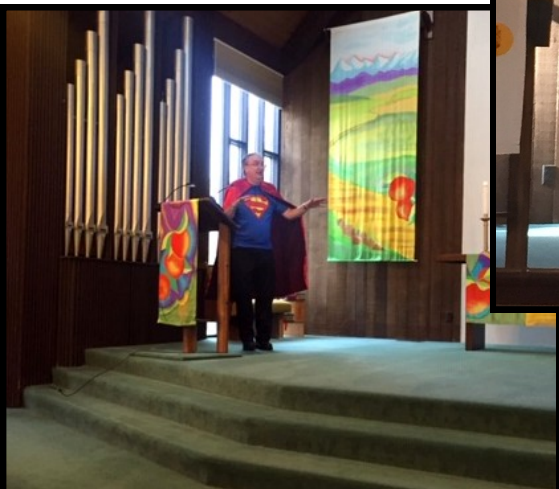

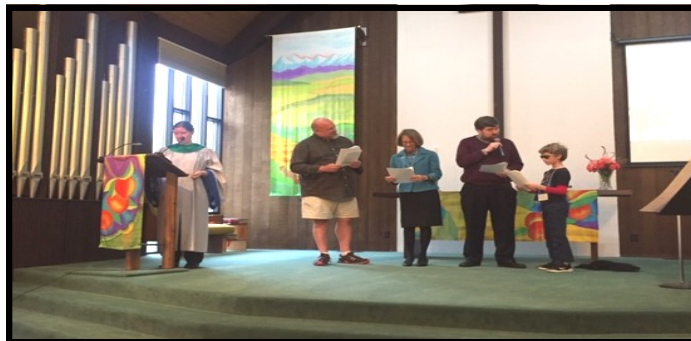

### LETTER FROM PCAF LEADERSHIP

Courage, compassion and resilience: these were the focus in 2017 as we honored PCAF's 30 years of fighting the HIV epidemic in the South Sound. And they are values we continue to rely on in our daily work.

- One of the most telling statistics about the success of PCAF's programs is that 91% of our HIV-positive clients had achieved viral suppression (aka, undetectable) – this is critical for people's health, as well as in preventing the spread of HIV.
- Client Services and Prevention, 2017 brought new programmatic developments, including:
  1. PrEP Case Management
  2. A motel voucher program to give people coming out of incarceration a safe and stable place to stay while they figure out their living and work situations; and
  3. Retooling of ID assistance program to help trans clients secure gender-affirming identification.

The past 30 years of service have given us a solid foundation upon which we can continue to build effective and innovative programs that serve the needs of our clients and communities, to carry out our mission, and to work towards an end to this epidemic.
